## Dear praying friends in Europe

## Honouring our Forefathers and Then Going Further

"Isaac re-opened the wells that had been dug in the time of his father Abraham, ... and he gave them the same names his father had given them. ... He moved on from there and dug another well, and no one quarrelled over it." (Genesis 26:18 & 22, NIV)

In 2019 we are following many generations of faithful believers who lived for Jesus and built the kingdom before us – our spiritual fathers and mothers. In celebrating our history, we honour them, and as the fifth commandment says, this brings blessing on us (Exodus 20:12). Then we must build on what they did and go further. We must ask God to open new spiritual wells in new places – new wells of revival!

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## Europe's Wells Worship & Prayer Initiative, 21-23 June 2019

In June 2018 a Canopy article introduced the idea of many groups praying simultaneously in the places of former revival, with the name "Timeline of Worship". This has become the "Europe's Wells" worship and prayer initiative, 21-23 June. We see all the places of former kingdom growth as spiritual wells which may have become blocked or covered over. Like drilling an artesian well, we will ask God to reopen these wells so that the life-giving water flows again!

Over 70 groups have signed up to worship and pray for three days, following these

Friday 21st – celebrate all that God has done over almost 2000 years in Europe Saturday 22nd – ask him to send spiritual life to these places again – reopening the ancient wells
Sunday 23rd – ask him to send new revival to the whole of Europe – digging new wells

Not just the recent wells of revival, but also those from a long time ago. So those in countries with more groups will support those with fewer groups.
