The Nationwide Festival of Light

On 25 September 1971 I joined tens of thousands of singing, banner-waving people at London's iconic Trafalgar Square for **the largest open-air Christian gathering in UK history. We came to witness for Jesus and identify with positive values for society: honour, decency and respect.** The 1960's brought us 'Make love not war' and 'Do your own thing' slogans and a rapid decline in public morality with many laws passed allowing abortion, easy divorce, and an explosion of sexually explicit material. Under a banner saying 'Moral Pollution Needs a Solution!' speakers challenged Christians of every denomination to speak out as 'salt of the earth, light to the world.'

'Proclaiming truth and demonstrating compassion.'

A Committee then began campaigning to strengthen family life, protect children and stand up for life, gathering evidence, advising MPs, writing articles and mobilising churches. In 1983 it was renamed CARE (Christian Action Research and Education) with Charlie Colchester and my husband, Lyndon Bowring, called to co-lead a growing army of 70,000 supporters to proclaim biblical truth and demonstrate Christ's compassion. Alongside political engagement CARE offered education training, foster care, people opening their homes, launched Care for the Family and other projects. Our original DNA remains. Today we focus on: preserving life; protecting children; sexual ethics and strengthening marriage and families; freedom of speech; plight of modern slavery victims and those with addictions.

CARE's partnership with the Church is crucial. We invest resources to **inform, equip and inspire Christians** to pray, engage with politicians and affirm truth.

Caring for the vulnerable

By 1983 a million unborn lives had been lost. The figure is now almost 11 million. We resolved then to fight all attempts to make **abortion** more accessible and also reach out to women through practical nonjudgmental care. By 2002, 157 CARE pregnancy advice centres were established.

CARE fears the sinister implications of proposed assisted suicide legislation and is working non-stop to oppose it.

CARE is concerned that free speech is under threat. Christians face workplace discrimination and prosecution for expressing faith-based views.

Back then **explicit sexual images** had become visible to children in many places. From 1978 on, CARE initiated legislation to counter this, also helping those addicted or otherwise affected. Research shows today's 'one click away' porn is being seen by even little children and young people's sexual attitudes risk becoming warped. The UK's Online Safety Act now requires age verification for internet sites. Some say this may never have happened without CARE.

Sexual exploitation ruins lives.

CARE was instrumental in Northern Ireland's groundbreaking 2015 Act on modern slavery to protect vulnerable trafficking victims and campaigned for similar laws in the rest of the UK. We are passionate to bring this evil to an end.

Prayer

I hope this article has stirred you. We believe God called CARE 'to the kingdom for such a time as this.' Perhaps He is inspiring similar ministries elsewhere in Europe.

'When the enemy comes in like flood, the Spirit of the Lord will lift a standard against him.' Isaiah 59;19
